



The Summary of Benefits and Coverage (SBC) document will help you choose a health plan. The SBC shows you how you and the plan would share the cost for covered health care services. **NOTE: Information about the cost of this plan (called the premium) will be provided separately. Important Questions	Answers	Why this Matters:
What is the overall <u>deductible</u> ?	Network: \$500/single, \$1,000/family Non-Network: \$1,000/single, \$2,000/family	Generally, you must pay all of the costs from <u>providers</u> up to the <u>deductible</u> amount before this <u>plan</u> begins to pay. If you have other family members on the <u>plan</u> , each family member must meet their own individual <u>deductible</u> until the total amount of <u>deductible</u> expenses paid by all family members meets the overall family <u>deductible</u> .
Are there services covered before you meet your <u>deductible</u> ?	Yes. Certain preventive care and all services with <u>copayments</u> are covered and paid by the plan before you meet your <u>deductible</u> .	This <u>plan</u> covers some items and services even if you haven't yet met the <u>deductible</u> amount. But a <u>copayment</u> or <u>coinsurance</u> may apply. For example, this <u>plan</u> covers certain <u>preventive services</u> without <u>cost sharing</u> and before you meet your <u>deductible</u> . Are there other <u>deductibles</u> for specific services?	Not applicable.	You don't have to meet <u>deductibles</u> for specific services.
What is the <u>out-of-pocket limit</u> for this <u>plan</u> ?	Coinsurance Limit: Network: \$2,000/single, \$4,000/family Non-Network: \$4,000/single, \$8,000/family Out-of-pocket Limit: Network: \$6,600/single, \$13,200/family	The <u>out-of-pocket limit</u> is the most you could pay in a year for covered services. If you have other family members in this <u>plan</u> , the overall family <u>out-of-pocket limit</u> must be met.
What is not included in the <u>out-of-pocket limit</u> ?	Balance-billed charges, health care this <u>plan</u> doesn't cover	Even though you pay these expenses, they don't count toward the <u>out-of-pocket limit</u> .
Will you pay less if you use a <u>network provider</u> ?	Yes, See MedMutual.com/SBC or call 800-540-2583 for a list of participating providers.	This <u>plan</u> uses a <u>provider network</u> . You will pay less if you use a <u>provider</u> in the plan's <u>network</u> . You will pay the most if you use an <u>out-of-network provider</u> , and you might receive a bill from a <u>provider</u> for the difference between the provider's charge and what your <u>plan</u> pays (<u>balance billing</u>). Be aware, your <u>network provider</u> might use an <u>out-of-network provider</u> , for some services (such as lab work). Check with your <u>provider</u> before you get services.
Do you need a <u>referral</u> to see a <u>specialist</u> ?	No.	You can see the <u>specialist</u> you choose without a <u>referral</u> .

Your Grievance and Appeals Rights: There are agencies that can help if you have a complaint against your plan for a denial of a claim. This complaint is called a grievance or appeal. Your plan documents also provide complete information to submit a claim, appeal, or a grievance for any reason to your plan. Does this Coverage Provide Minimum Essential Coverage? Yes.

If you don't have **Minimum Essential Coverage** for a month, you'll have to make a payment when you file your tax return unless you qualify for an exemption from the requirement that you have health coverage for that month.

Does this Coverage Meet the Minimum Value Standard? Yes.

If your plan doesn't meet the **Minimum Value Standards**, you may be eligible for a **premium tax credit** to help you pay for a plan through the **Marketplace**.

About these Coverage Examples:



This is not a cost estimator. Treatments shown are just examples of how this **plan** might cover medical care. Your actual costs will be different depending on the actual care you receive, the prices your **providers** charge, and many other factors. Focus on the **cost sharing** amounts (**deductibles**, **copayments** and **coinsurance**) and **excluded services** under the **plan**. Use this information to compare the portion of costs you might pay under different health **plans**. Please note these coverage examples are based on self-only coverage.

Peg is Having a Baby
(9 months of network pre-natal care and a hospital delivery)

- **The plan's overall deductible** \$500
- **Specialist** coinsurance 20%
- **Hospital (facility)** coinsurance 20%
- **Other** coinsurance 20%

This EXAMPLE event includes services like:

Specialist office visits (*prenatal care*)
 Childbirth/Delivery Professional Services
 Childbirth/Delivery Facility Services
 Diagnostic tests (*ultrasounds and blood work*)
 Specialist visit (*anesthesia*)

Total Example Cost	\$12,800
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In this example, Peg would pay:

Managing Joe's type 2 Diabetes
(a year of routine network care of a well-controlled condition)

- **The plan's overall deductible** \$500
- **Specialist** coinsurance 20%
- **Hospital (facility)** coinsurance 20%
- **Other** coinsurance 20%

This EXAMPLE event includes services like:

Primary care physician office visits (*including disease education*)
 Diagnostic tests (*blood work*)
 Prescription drugs
 Durable medical equipment (*glucose meter*)

Total Example Cost	\$7,400
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In this example, Joe would pay:

<i>Cost Sharing</i>	
Deductibles	\$500
Copayments	\$1,000
Coinsurance	\$100
<i>What isn't covered</i>	
Limits or exclusions	\$60
The total Joe would pay is	\$1,660

Mia's Simple Fracture
(network emergency room visit and follow up care)

- **The plan's overall deductible** \$500
- **Specialist** coinsurance 20%
- **Hospital (facility)** coinsurance 20%
- **Other** coinsurance 20%

This EXAMPLE event includes services like:

Emergency room care (*including medical supplies*)
 Diagnostic test (*x-ray*)
 Durable medical equipment (*crutches*)
 Rehabilitation services (*physical therapy*)

Total Example Cost	\$1,900
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In this example, Mia would pay:

<i>Cost Sharing</i>	
Deductibles	\$500
Copayments	\$0
Coinsurance	\$200
<i>What isn't covered</i>	
Limits or exclusions	\$40
The total Mia would pay is	\$740

The **plan** would be responsible for the other costs of these EXAMPLE covered services.
